

OPTION B

VISIT TO THE INTEGRATED FUSINA POLLUTION CONTROL PROJECT

MORNING

The Integrated Fusina Pollution Control Project (PIF) ensures complete control of all polluting inflows from the central area of the drainage basin. Intensive water treatment is combined with discharge in an area where the risk to the lagoon and the mainland is reduced to minimal. Water from the Fusina water treatment plant are currently transferred by a pipeline that collects the civil and industrial waste waters from the Mestre, Marghera, and Mira areas and sends them mixed together to Fusina for treatment.

The PIF Project envisions separating civil and industrial waste water supply lines at the partial responsibility of VERITAS, partially through other interventions, and partially through project financing, and in particular, through:

- the installation of post-treatment modules for waste waters "A" and "B" (VERITAS water treatment plant)
- supply lines for the recycling of waste water "A" and the transfer of waste water "B" (land-based pipelines)
- biological treatment of waste water "A" (Tank "A")
- a line for discharge into the Adriatic sea.

10.00 arrival in Venice and guests reception at Fusina Integrated Project building

10.00 - 11.00 brief introduction of the performed and the ongoing works

11.00 - 12.00 bus tour to visit the area named 23HA, where the treatment plants of sediments are located, and Vallone Moranzani landfill

AFTERNOON

TOUR IN VENICE

ST. MARK'S SQUARE AND HIDDEN VENICE

Meeting point: Riva degli Schiavoni. The tour will start in St. Mark's Square, which used to be the political and religious center of the city. An introduction about Venice will be given there, with a focus on the most important monuments of the square: the Doge's Palace, the Library, the two Columns, St. Mark's Belltower, the Basilica, the Clock Tower, the Napoleonic Wing and the Procuratie.

The tour will continue going through the calli, campi and campielli, the typical Venetian spaces, to get an impression of the true Venice and its characteristic elements.



The further destinations will be Campo Santa Maria Formosa and Campo San Giovanni e Paolo in the district ("sestiere") of Castello, Santa Maria dei Miracoli and Corte del Milion, where Marco Polo was born and lived until 17, in the district of Cannaregio.

Crossing the well-known Rialto Bridge, the walk will go through the side streets and short-cuts to reach Campo San Polo and, at last, the gorgeous church of Santa Maria Gloriosa dei Frari, one of the two main Gothic churches in Venice, where the tour will end.
